Bar Exam Format

The Kentucky bar exam is a two day bar exam. Kentucky is not a UBE state.

Day 1: Six Multistate Essay Exam (MEE) questions and six Kentucky Essay Questions.

Day 2: Multistate Bar Exam (MBE), a 200-question, multiple choice exam.

Subjects Tested

MEE: Business Associations (Agency and Partnership; Corporations and Limited Liability Companies), Civil Procedure, Conflict of Laws, Constitutional Law, Contracts (including Article 2 [Sales] of the Uniform Commercial Code), Criminal Law and Procedure, Evidence, Family Law, Real Property, Torts, Trusts and Estates (Decedents' Estates; Trusts and Future Interests), and Article 9 (Secured Transactions) of the Uniform Commercial Code.

Kentucky Essay Questions: Each of the 6 Kentucky essay questions cover one or more of the following subjects: Contracts, including sales and secured transactions, Constitutional Law, Business Entities (corporation, partnerships and/or others), Criminal Law and Procedure, Evidence, Civil Procedure, Family Law, Property (real and/or personal), Torts, Estates (wills and/or trusts). Such other subjects as the Board may select from among questions from the National Conference of Bar Examiners.

MBE: Civil Procedure, Constitutional Law, Contracts, Criminal Law and Procedure, Evidence, Real Property, and Torts.
