Bar Exam Format

The Mississippi Bar Exam is a two-day exam. Mississippi has not adopted the Uniform Bar Exam (UBE).

Day 1: Six essay questions drafted by the Mississippi state board, the Multistate Performance Test (MPT) drafter by the National Conference of Bar Examiners and six Multistate Essay Exam (MEE) questions.

Day 2: Multistate Bar Exam (MBE), a 200-question, multiple-choice exam.

Subjects Tested

Mississippi Subjects: Administrative Law, Agency, Bankruptcy, Conflict of Laws, Corporations, Domestic Relations, Federal Income Tax, Federal Jurisdiction & Rules of Civil Procedure, MS Constitutional Law, Partnerships, Practice & Procedure of MS Courts, Professional Conduct & Ethics, Sales, Secured Transactions, UCC, Wills, Estates, Trusts & Future Interests, Worker's Compensation, plus all MBE subjects listed above. (Prior to exam, the Mississippi Board indicates to all applicants for that exam which subjects will be tested on the six essays drafted by the Board.)

MPT: "Closed universe" practical problem using instructions, factual data, cases, statutes and other reference material supplied by examiners.

MEE: Business Associations (Agency and Partnership; Corporations and Limited Liability Companies), Civil Procedure, Conflict of Laws, Constitutional Law, Contracts (including Article 2 [Sales] of the Uniform Commercial Code), Criminal Law and Procedure, Evidence, Family Law, Real Property, Torts, Trusts and Estates (Decedents' Estates; Trusts and Future Interests), and Article 9 (Secured Transactions) of the Uniform Commercial Code.

MBE: Civil Procedure, Constitutional Law, Contracts, Criminal Law and Procedure, Evidence, Real Property, and Torts.
