Bar Exam Format

The Nevada Bar Exam is a 3-day exam. Nevada has not adopted the Uniform Bar Exam (UBE).

Day 1: Nevada essay questions prepared by the Nevada examiners and one Multistate Performance Test (MPT).

Day 2: Multistate Bar Exam (MBE), a 200 question, multiple-choice exam.

Day 3: Nevada essay questions prepared by the Nevada examiners.

Subjects Tested

Nevada Essay Subjects: Essay examination subjects include a required question on legal ethics as well as the possible following subjects: Agency and Partnership; Community Property; Conflict of Laws; Constitutional Law; Contracts; Corporations; Criminal Law and Procedure; Evidence; Persons and Domestic Relations; Real Property; Remedies; Torts; Uniform Commercial Code (Articles 2 and 9); Wills, Estates and Trusts; as well as pleadings and practices under both the Nevada Rules of Civil Procedure and the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure. Both fundamental legal principles and Nevada law are tested and may embrace more than a single subject.

MPT: "Closed universe" practical problem using instructions, factual data, cases, statutes and other reference material supplied by examiners.

MBE: Civil Procedure, Constitutional Law, Contracts, Criminal Law and Procedure, Evidence, Real Property, and Torts.
