## Alum Receives National IP Award

Patent lawyer **Howard Bremer '49**, a pioneer in university-based technology transfer, is the 2006 winner of the Jefferson Award, an annual recognition of outstanding contributors to intellectual property law in the United States.

Bremer, a patent attorney with the Wisconsin Alumni Research Foundation (WARF) who has been called the “father of university licensing,” received the Jefferson medal in June.

Bremer has wielded tremendous influence in the area of technology transfer between universities and private companies.
