

Baseline: What is Accessibility?

- Wide-ranging overall: Physical and digital
 - "Ensuring equal access to programs, services and events for people with disabilities is our shared responsibility towards right-doing and benefits everyone." -- https://accessible.wisc.edu
- UW Digital Accessibility Policy adopted in 2021
 - Implementation is <u>phased</u> through 2030
- Focus for today: Document creation



What's new this year and why?

2023–24: Digital documents

Goal: Integrate accessibility practices into our document creation processes, fix existing high-priority content, document accessibility barriers and have a plan to provide people with access

Think of this as a new core proficiency.

The way we organize content for screen readers is using the tools we're often familiar with: Titles, headings, alt text, lists and tables.



What does this mean to me?

- All of us need to learn how to create accessible documents
- First step: Focus on most commonly used kinds
 - Word
 - PowerPoint


**Yes, we also use PDFs, but creating them from clean documents is much easier than cleaning them up. Don't overwhelm SpongeBob.





Sidebar: What does 'clean' mean?

- If you don't create a document properly, when you export it to PDF, you have to reorder items, tag them or even completely redo work.
- It's extremely frustrating and inefficient
