What is Hope and a Future?

Hope and a Future has completed the accessible addition to its licensed, four-bed Adult Family Home (AFH). It is home to residents and live-in staff, which includes a registered nurse, registered occupational therapist, pharmacy technician, certified nursing assistants, and their children. With the help of community volunteers, a full-time art/activity therapist offers a personalized activity program which caters to the interests of the individual residents and draws in community members for monthly events. Music, dance, arts & crafts, food, parties, exercise, pet therapy, swimming, and gardening are all part of the program. The beautiful 5.5-acre property has been maintained by an intergenerational community of over 300 volunteers and has and continues to be the site of many family gatherings including reunions, bridal and baby showers, holiday festivities, and memorials.

What is Porchlight, Inc.?

Porchlight provides affordable housing at 23 locations, where over 420 residents work with Porchlight staff to address the root causes of homelessness, such as access to education, secure employment, and mental health services. Porchlight provides emergency shelter, low-cost transitional and permanent housing, and supportive services to the homeless and low-income population of Dane County. Programs include the Men's Drop-In Shelter; Safe Haven for homeless men and women with mental illness; the Hospitality House for homeless families and individuals seeking employment and housing resources; and the permanent and transitional housing program, which provides 245 units of housing at scattered sites located throughout Madison and Dane County.
