Bar Exam Format

The Indiana bar exam is a two-day exam. Indiana has not adopted the UBE.

Day 1: Two 90-minute Multistate Performance Test (MPT) questions and a 4 hour Indiana essay examination (IEE) consisting of six questions, which are not necessarily limited to one subject matter.

Day 2: Multistate Bar Exam (MBE), a six-hour, 200-question multiple-choice exam.

Subjects Tested

MPT: "Closed universe" practical questions using instructions, factual data, cases, statutes and other reference material supplied by examiners.

IEE: Administrative law, Business organizations, Family law, Federal and state personal income tax, corporate tax, and estate and gift tax, Indiana constitutional law, Indiana employment law, including wage payment and wage claim statutes, Indiana debt collection, including garnishment, attachment, and bankruptcy exemptions, Residential landlord-tenant law, Pleading and practice, including statutes of limitation and the Indiana Tort Claims Act, Secured transactions, Wills, trusts and estates.

MBE: Civil Procedure, Constitutional Law, Contracts, Criminal Law and Procedure, Evidence, Real Property, and Torts.
