Bar Exam Format

The Oklahoma bar exam is a two-day exam. Oklahoma has not adopted the Uniform Bar Exam (UBE).

Day 1: 16 Essay questions written by the Oklahoma Bar examiners.

Day 2: Multistate Bar Exam (MBE), a six-hour, 200-question, multiple-choice exam.

Subjects Tested

Oklahoma Essay Subjects:

The first day of the exam is the essay portion; the second day is Multistate. The essay portion of the exam covers combinations of the following subjects (Rules Governing Admission, Rule Five); Oklahoma Rules of Professional Conduct; Commercial law, which may include - Contracts, Uniform Commercial Code, Consumer law, and Creditor's rights, including bankruptcy; Property; Procedural Law, which may include - Pleadings, Practice, Evidence, and Remedies (damages, restitution and equity); Criminal Law; Business Associations, which may include - Agency, Partnerships (including joint ventures), Corporations, and Limited Liability Companies; Constitutional and Administrative Law; Torts; Intestate Succession, wills, trusts, estate planning, including federal estate and gift taxation; Conflicts of law; and Family law.

MBE: Civil Procedure, Constitutional Law, Contracts, Criminal Law and Procedure, Evidence, Real Property, and Torts.
