1L

Fall semester
Take all required classes

Spring semester
Take all required classes;
Be intentionally reflective with your elective

2L

Fall semester:
Enroll in classes that fulfill diploma privilege, helpful to an area of law you are interested in, and/or *helpful for bar preparedness*

Multi-state professional responsibility exam (MPRE) is required to practice law in most states.

3L
