The Senior Managing Editors for next year will be Jenna Pritsos and Jayme Durkee. Jenna and Jayme will lead the journal's production, editing, and cite-checking processes, which are critical to the journal's academic integrity and the quality of its publications.

Next year's Symposium topic is *The Evolving Role of In-House and General Counsels*. The two Symposium Editors, Liz Sanger and Nathaniel Inglis Steinfeld, will organize this event. It will draw scholars from around the nation to present papers on the role of chief legal officers.

Shane Hoffmann was selected by the membership to be Business Editor. In addition to his editorial duties, Shane will work with subscribers, vendors, and school officials to manage the *Law Review's* finances and operations.

Rounding out the Senior Board, James DeBriyn was elected Web Editor, a new position on the journal's Senior Board. He will work with the Senior Board and school officials to enhance the archives and improve the journal's website.
